

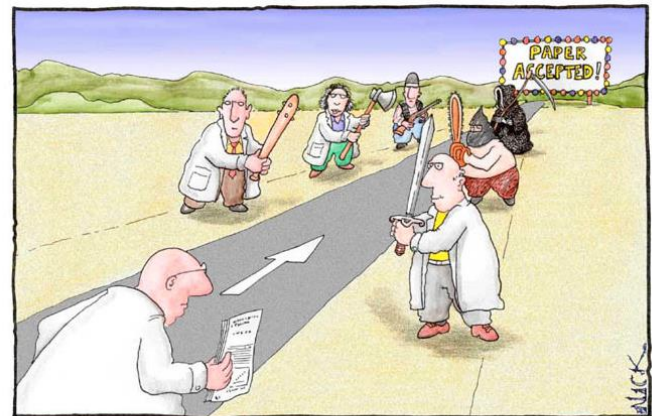
Hastily prepared revisions are likely to be

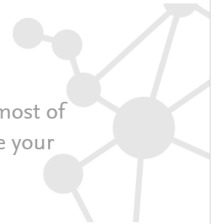
